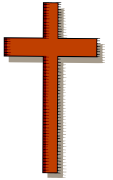

### **An Evidence Based Faith**

A 3 week free course on Wednesday evenings in October is open to all, of whatever faith or none. The course is led by Henry Corbett, vicar of St Peter's and St John Chrysostom's Churches in Everton, warden of Shrewsbury House Youth and Community Centre.

#### **The dates and topics are:**

**3rd October:** All of us have a view about life, a world-view, however provisional or partial it may be. Does our view make sense of all the available evidence, from science, from history, from our own experience?

**10th October:** We look for role models, heroes, heroines, sometimes even Messiahs. Does anyone really match up to our hopes when the evidence is looked at, when their lives are opened up to scrutiny?

**17th October:** How reliable is the evidence of religious or spiritual experiences? No knock-down proof, there is room for choice, but what view of life, what world-view fits the available evidence?

### **Science and Religion**

While many claim science and religion shouldn't mix, a new survey has suggested almost a third of scientists have a faith in God. One thousand people were questioned from professions linked to science with 13% saying they practised a religious faith and 18% saying they were non-practicing, but religious. Around 25% said they were atheist suggesting scientists are more likely to be religious than atheist. A quarter of respondents said science and religion were contradictory but just under half said the two cannot be compared as they refer to different things. Speaking to Premier Christian Media about the findings, Professor Keith Fox, from the Faraday Institute for Science and Religion said: "I don't see a conflict between the two. "Science itself is fairly neutral as to whether there is or isn't a God. It's a wonderful world that we live in - science is privileged to explore it but there's limits to what it can do and what it can say."
